About Company of Good Fellowship

The Company of Good Fellowship is a 12-week professional development programme designed to nurture changemakers from the private and public sectors, as well as Institutes of Higher Learning. Participants, also known as Company of Good Fellows, will be equipped with the knowledge and tools to activate their organisation's Corporate Purpose and drive positive impact in the ecosystem.



Launched in 2017, the Company of Good Fellowship has since had 217 Fellows from 168 organisations graduate across seven intakes of the programme.

From Corporate Giving...

In 2017, the Company of Good Fellowship was launched by the National Volunteer & Philanthropy eople Centre (NVPC) with the goal of nurturing business professionals in Singapore to lead their organisations towards corporate giving. This addressed a gap where many companies and their employees had wanted to give back to society, but did not have the internal capabilities to do so at a strategic and sustainable level.

Fellows learned and applied the 4 'l' Framework of Investment, Integration, Institutionalisation, and Impact to develop and implement meaningful corporate giving initiatives that leveraged their organisations' unique resources to create positive impact.

Along the way, there will be consultation clinics and reflection sessions to help Fellows unpack and crystallise their learnings, and sharpen their thought processes when developing their Action Projects.

The programme has also helped Fellows to form close-knit networks and build camaraderie that lasts beyond their graduation.

In 2023, NVPC launched the Corporate Purpose Framework and Blueprint for businesses in Singapore, guiding companies to articulate and activate their Corporate Purpose to create positive impact in the People, Society, Governance, Environment, and Economic dimensions.

Following the introduction of NVPC's Company of Good 2.0 strategy, the Company of Good Fellowship underwent transformative enhancements to help Fellows to unlock the power of their companies' purpose to drive positive change across every level and function of the organisation, from strategy to operations, creating win-win outcomes for business and society.

In planning his Action Project, Kah Howe aimed to upskill and uplift the migrant workers employed by his company, Seah Kim Cheok Construction. Recognising the challenges and adversities that this community faces in social integration and career advancements, he developed an online learning platform where migrant workers can learn English in their native language during their own time, free of charge.

What started out as an Action Project has since grown into a nonprofit called Grow Studio, not only empowering migrant workers with the tools and support to succeed in their careers in Singapore, but also expanding to teach dialects to younger generations so they can better communicate with seniors.



Grow Studio is deeply committed to fostering positive change within communities and believes in harnessing the power of technology to bridge gaps, foster understanding, and uplift lives.

Kevin is the founder of Vicinity Studio, a video content agency dedicated to impactful Kevin storytelling, backed by a vibrant team of 60. Driven by a corporate purpose to empower youths by unlocking their creative potential, they provide masterclasses, learning journeys, and (Intake 6) career guidance for young people including those at risk, creating pathways for them to enter and grow in the media industry. These sessions bring in leading experts to provide industry insights, ranging from award-winning creative talents sharing their own creative approach and professional journey, to specialists delivering technical skills training. In addition, Vicinity Studio partners with ITE to provide internship opportunities, giving hands-on training to at-risk youths and offering valuable industry exposure and mentorship to help them build confidence and unlock their potential. Building Connections and Forming Partnerships

The sense of community is a hallmark of the Fellowship journey, with learning experiences designed to encourage peer-to-peer engagement and knowledge exchange. Fellows are not only empowered to succeed individually, but also supported to make connections and partnerships that amplify their collective impact.

Through the programme, many of our Fellows form networks and friendships with like-minded professionals that span sectors and last beyond the Fellowship.





Elaine is a bridge builder in the community, passionate about connecting people and harnessing collective resources to those in need. John, who started Renov-Aid, shares this vision, using his initiative to equip volunteers with essential renovation skills to empower a capable community ready to help others.

During a recent visit to Children's Wishing Well, Elaine noticed that some of the interior areas were in suboptimal conditions, and partnered with John to launch Project Clean White Walls, a community-driven initiative to refresh the space and provide a welcoming environment for the children.

Encouraged, Elaine has been extending invitations to more Fellows to join in contributing to this meaningful cause. This includes curating classes for the children and youths to learn about graphic design, digital storytelling, and other useful skills.





PlayPan is a social initiative that was started at the old Peace Centre by Gary (Intake 3) and Yvonne (Intake 4). The project was joined by other Fellows including Grace (Intake 5), Michael (Intake 4), James (Intake 3), Tiong Hui (Intake 6), and even Pearla (Intake 7)—whom each contributed their Time, Talent, Treasure, Ties, and Testimony to PlayPan's success.

Championing the notion to Play and Do Good, PlayPan serves as a vibrant placemaking and community-building hub for empowering communities and bringing diverse changemakers together for creative collaboration.

This includes bringing the People, Public and Private sectors together to reimagine giving and create a social economy, and PlayPan welcomes more corporates to come forward and collaborate to provide more opportunities for community engagement in Singapore.



Rallying Stakeholders and Kickstarting Ecosystem Movements

The Company of Good Fellowship provides Fellows with a holistic perspective to understand the role of their organisations in the ecosystem.

Equipped with the tools to articulate their corporate purpose, Fellows are challenged to look even beyond their usual stakeholders and identify new areas to multiply their impact, creating mutual value for their organisations as well as the communities they operate in.

Kathleen and her team at EY have played a vital role as a Project Manager for Project V, a structured corporate volunteering programme led by NVPC and NCSS, since the programme's pilot. With diverse stakeholders such as corporate volunteers, volunteer managers, social service agencies and their clients, Kathleen has expertly managed multiple project streams and added value to the engagements that take place as part of the programme.

This included the publication of a report that details best practices around how corporates and community partners can successfully kickstart and sustain a strategic partnership in volunteering, addressing systemic challenges and fostering community development.

The Project V pilot saw over 1,900 volunteers contribute more than 6,100 volunteering hours across 21 such partnerships.



Through transitioning from a Fellow to a Mentor in the Fellowship, I have learnt that mentoring is not about giving answers. It's about offering different perspectives by playing the role of a layman listening to their organisation and Corporate Purpose.

One of the highlights for me is learning more about other industries and professions. This experience has enriched my knowledge, and I enjoy the 'intellectual sparring' with mentees through challenging their way of thinking and having my perspectives concurrently challenged!"

The community of Corporate Purpose professionals is very small. So for anyone like me who really wants to share learnings and insights, the Company of Good Fellowship is the best way to find mentees who will find value in it. It added to my professional development as well, helping my growth as an industry leader who is actively involved in developing talent and to stay on top of industry trends.

There's also a lot of reverse mentoring that happens organically. For example, one of my mentees was from a client-side organisation, and the insights gained from the sector helped us better carve out strategic collaborations through purpose-driven programmes. Some of my mentees are now dear friends from whom I seek advice and support."



I am very humbled to be able to give back to the vNVPC community and Fellowship, which I have journeyed with for the last 6 years. Ideating Action Projects on paper is one thing, seeing them to fruition is another—I enjoy sharing my own experiences to help mentees on their Action Projects to ensure they dream big yet keep it practical within their varying constraints.

Some of my highlights and 'proud parent' moments include witnessing mentees' Action Project presentations and seeing how they have grown, together with their projects having evolved over the programme. One of my mentees received the top score for their Action Project, one was an excellent emcee at the graduation event, and I even had a mentee who ended up as my wedding planner!"
